
START OF TERM INFORMATION



TRANSITION CHALLENGES




- Moving from familiar surroundings to unfamiliar surroundings.




MIXED ABILITY GROUPINGS

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• Mixed-ability grouping in First Year leads to improved progress in literacy and numeracy and can give students more confidence as learners.











CHANGE IN TEST SCORES OVER FIRST YEAR







PROMOTING POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR:

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The school acknowledges the good behaviour of students as follows:

- Throughout the year students who display a positive attitude to school life will be acknowledged by their Class Tutor/Year Head at Tutor Class, Assemblies or Award Ceremonies.

ATTENDANCE



- Regular and punctual attendance is expected.
- Creates a lifelong habit of good attendance and punctuality
- Students absent for 10% of the year show reduced grade averages and reduced scores in core subjects.
- This will result in missing more than a year at school over your time in education.
- Half of students who miss 2-4 days in September will go on to miss nearly a month of school.
- When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and chances of finishing school.
